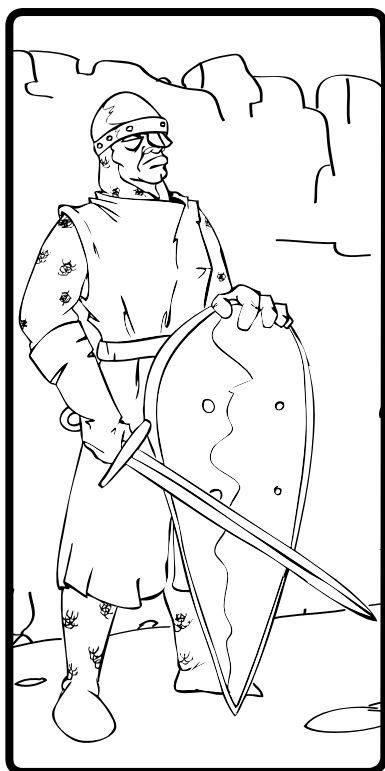

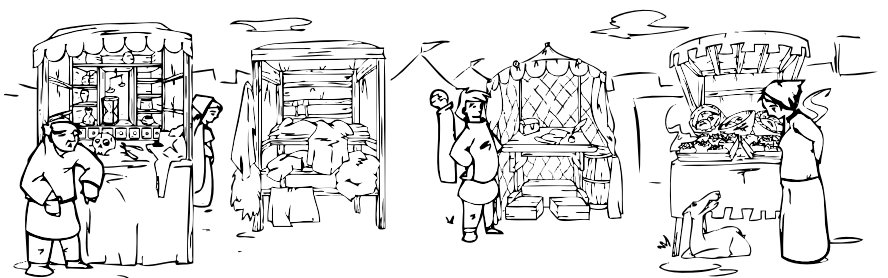

4 You could visit a barber-surgeon to get a sore tooth pulled out (without anaesthetic).

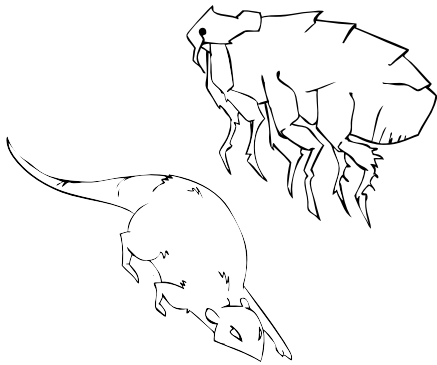




4 Death and disease

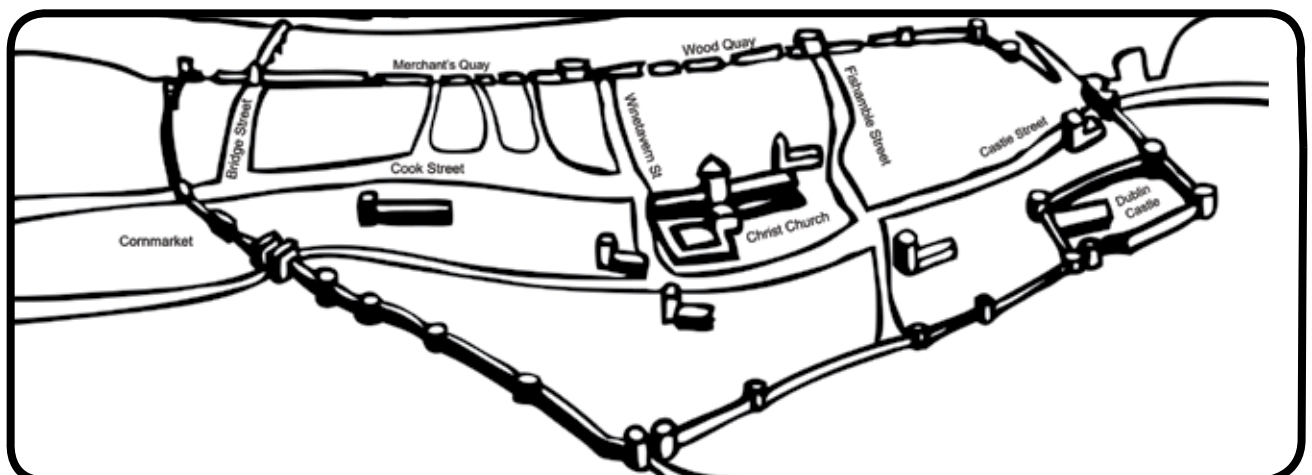

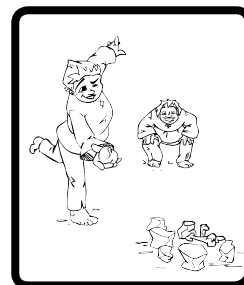

Write three reasons why you would or would not like to have lived in medieval Dublin.

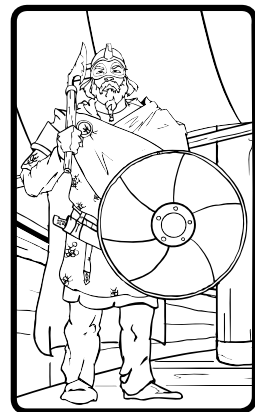
