A Viking house

In the Viking house you heard how the Vikings built their houses. They built them from wooden posts and mud. This technique was called 'wattle and daub'. A line of wooden posts was stuck into the ground. Twigs and branches were woven between them to make the wall strong. The walls were covered with mud and even animal dung! This kept the house warm but it probably smelled too.


Look at the picture of the Viking house below. Circle the five objects that do not belong here.






Viking rune letters

You will have seen some strange-looking objects when you walked through Dublinia's






